Minutes – August 25, 2010

The meeting of the Wilmington Neighborhood Council (WNC) was called to order by Chair Tom Dahlgren at 6:10 PM at the Wilmington Senior Center, 1371 Eubank Ave., Wilmington.

Mr. Dahlgren introduced himself and gave brief statement: “All stakeholders including residents, property and business owners, people who work in Wilmington, members of non-profit, educational, church, and service organization, representatives of local labor unions and participants at local parks and museums are encouraged to participate in the Wilmington Neighborhood Council (WNC). The WNC and you can make a difference in the delivery of City services to our community.”

Truck Task Force on July 2 – 21 Stops, 2 impounds along with 14 citations and 6 warnings

Receiving complaints of trucks in residential area because of Harry Bridges Blvd. work

Worked with Animal Services Department – July 15 – 20 dogs impounded

This was done for the first time in the City of LA and coordinated through CD15/Luna
